Healthy Beginnings at Home

BPA is the lead consultant for Healthy Beginnings at Home (HBAH), a research project testing the impact of providing rental assistance with housing stabilization services to pregnant women, who are living in highly unstable housing, and are at greater risk of infant mortality. HBAH is rigorously evaluating its findings to strengthen the evidence for housing stabilization and how it addresses infant mortality, can improve health outcomes for women and their infants.
